



ADULT SOFTBALL DETAILS

DIVISIONS

- Men's
 - Men's divisions will play with the homerun rule based on a one and up. Each team gets a homerun until the other team hits a homerun then each team gets one homerun again. If a team hits a second homerun before the other team hits their first it will be an out.
 - Divisions will be put together by the Athletics staff in an attempt to create balanced a competitive play.
- Co-ed
 - Co-ed divisions will play with the homerun rule based on a one and up. Each team gets a homerun until the other team hits a homerun then each team gets one homerun again. If a team hits a second homerun before the other team hits their first it will be an out.
 - Coed teams will consist of at least three females and seven males with a maximum roster of 20.
 - Divisions will be put together by the Athletics staff in an attempt to create balanced and competitive play.

NIGHTS OF PLAY

- Mon. / Tue. / Wed. /Thu.
- Co-ed will only be offered on Mondays and Thursdays
- Games only on the night of play teams are registered for

SEASON

- Play begins the week of Sept. 8-Nov. 19

EQUIPMENT

- Bats must be ASA approved – visit asasoftball.org for complete list
- Team must have at least 2 men's softballs for men's division
 - Men's use a 12" diameter ball with red stitching, .520 core max or under, and compression of 300 lbs. or less
 - Women use an 11" diameter ball with red stitching, .520 core max or under, and compression of 300 lbs. or less

GAME TIMES

- Depending on the number of teams
 - 6:30, 7:30, 8:30, 9:30 p.m., etc.

MANAGER'S MEETING

- A mandatory virtual manager orientation will be scheduled to review expectations. Athletics staff will notify all managers via email and/or phone with more information.



SCORECARDS

- **Game scorecards will follow a pick-up and drop-off system-**
 - ALL game scorecards for each night will be created by City athletics staff and be placed on each assigned field for umpires to collect. Blank scorecards will be available, if needed.
 - Scorecards are to be handled by officials ONLY. Umpires and officials will distribute to team captains/managers on each field, as needed.
 - NO team coaches, spectators, participants, etc. may pick up or drop off scorecards.
 - There will NOT be City athletic staff present throughout the entire night to answer questions related to scorecards.
 - City athletics staff will then collect scorecards the following day to record scores and post online at teamsideline.com/collegestation.

ROSTERS

- Team rosters will serve as a team's batting/kicking order for each game.
- Blank team rosters will be provided for every team at their assigned fields. All team members playing that evening are asked to print and sign a roster prior to the start of their game and turn into the umpires. Umpires will collect and keep all rosters on their assigned field for athletics staff to collect the following day.
- There will NOT be City athletic staff present throughout the entire night to answer questions related to rosters.

ADULT SOFTBALL PLAYING RULES

Amateur Softball Association (ASA) Rules will apply with the exception of the following rules published here.

GAME LENGTH

- Games will be seven (7) innings with a fifty (50) minute time limit.
- If time has expired before seven (7) innings has been played, the current inning will be allowed to finish and the game will end with the completion of that inning.
- In the event of excessive inclement weather, all options will be used to complete the season. This includes games being played on different nights of the week from your regular night of play and weekends.

RUN RULE

- If a team is ahead by twenty (20) or more runs after three (3) innings, fifteen (15) or more after four (4) innings or ten (10) or more after five (5) innings then game will be declared over.
- The home team will get to bat in the bottom of the inning if they are the trailing team.

HOME RUN LIMITS/DIVISIONS

- **Men's**
 - The Men's divisions will play with the homerun rule based on a one and up. Each team gets a homerun until the other team hits a homerun then each team gets one homerun again. If a team hits a second homerun before the other team hits their first, it will be an out.
- **Coed (Only Mondays and Thursdays)**
 - The Coed divisions will play with the homerun rule based on a one and up. Each team gets a homerun until the other team hits a homerun then each team gets one homerun again. If a team hits a second homerun before the other team hits their first, it will be an out.
- The Men's and Coed divisions will be split into subdivisions at the Athletics staff's discretion.

EQUIPMENT

- Only USA/ASA approved softball balls will be legal for play.
- Must be a yellow cover.
 - Men's Division – 12" diameter, red stitched, .520 core max or under, and compression of 300 lbs. or less.
 - Coed Division – Women will hit an 11" diameter ball with red stitching, .520 core max or under, and 300 lbs. or less with an USAASA stamp. Men will hit a 12" diameter ball with red stitching, .520 core max or under, and compression of 300 lbs. or less with an ASA stamp.
- Steel spikes are not permitted in league play.

GAME TIMES

- Games will begin at 6:30, 7:30, 8:30 and 9:30 p.m., etc.
- There will be a ten (10) minute grace period for the 6:30 p.m. games. The game clock will be running during the grace period. If not enough players are present by then, the game will be declared a forfeit.
- For all other start times, game time is forfeit time.
- Eight (8) players must be present to start a game. "Ghost outs" will be utilized for lineups of fewer than ten (10) batters. "Ghost outs" will be placed at the **lowest possible position in your lineup**.



COED RULES

- Coed teams will consist of at least three females and seven males.
- Players can be anywhere on the field. You do not have to have alternating pitcher and catcher.
- Players in the infield must be in front of all players in the outfield before the ball is hit.
- The batting order will require the first six batters to be alternating, but every batter after that can be of any sex. You can bat up to 12 players but at least three of the players must be female.
- A male batter only walks if following a female batter.
- A courtesy runner is now allowed in Coed to be used for both a male and female player once per half inning.

MEN'S RULES

- No stealing will be allowed.
- You can have a maximum of 11 batters in your lineup.

PITCHER

- Pitchers will be protected from line drives up the middle. A line drive will be defined as any ball that goes through the protected pitching area, marked on the field, and ranges from the pitchers head to the pitchers feet. Any ball that strikes the ground first will not be included in this rule interpretation.
- **Team penalties occurrence per game:**
 - 1st team occurrence - Dead ball. Batter is out. (inning continues)
 - 2nd team occurrence – Dead ball. Inning ending out. If same player commits 1st & 2nd occurrence, below highlighted rule applies.
 - 3rd team occurrence - Dead ball. Game forfeit.
- **Individual penalties occurrence per season:**
 - 1st occurrence – Dead Ball. Batter is out.
 - 2nd occurrence – Dead Ball. Player is ejected from game and normal ejection rules apply.

BATTING

- Each batter will step up to the plate with a count of one (1) ball and one (1) strike.
- A foul ball with two strikes will result in an out.

TIE BREAKER

- When the game is tied after time or 7 innings has expired, the Progressive International Tie-Breaker will go into effect. In the first extra inning, the last batter to complete his/her turn at bat will start the inning on second base. Should any more innings need to be played the last two batters to complete his/her turn will start the inning on second and third base.

SCOREKEEPING

- The official scorekeeper is the responsibility of the home team. If the score is in doubt the umpire will compare scorebooks and resolve any discrepancies.

PLAYER CONDUCT

- Profanity, vulgarity, unsportsmanlike behavior or misconduct of any kind that is detrimental to the game of softball and its purpose will not be tolerated. Athletic staff, City employees, League officials or umpires shall remove the offending parties from the park and the Police will be called if deemed necessary.
- **Any person ejected for profanity, vulgarity, or unsportsmanlike behavior will receive a minimum eight (8) day suspension to be served beginning immediately and could be longer if the infraction warrants it. If a player is ejected from a game, then they must leave the park for the remainder of the night.**



- The consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages and/or illegal substances by participants or spectators may be cause for immediate removal from the park. If a player is caught consuming and/or possessing alcohol during a game (either inside or outside of the dugout) the player will be disqualified or ejected from the game. If a player is disqualified the team can provide a legal substitution or a “Ghost Out” will be placed in the disqualified player’s position in the line-up. If the player is ejected the team must provide a legal substitution or the team forfeits the game.

ELIGIBILITY

- Players in City of College Station adult leagues must be at least 18 years of age at the time of participation.
- Male players may play on (1) men's slow pitch team and (1) co-ed team per night.
- Female players have no rule restriction on the number of teams they can play per night or division.
- **Rosters are the basis for the legality of players and are due prior to the start of your game for the evening. Failure to turn in a roster each night before the start of a game will result in an automatic forfeit.**
 - Blank team rosters will be provided for every team at their assigned fields. All team members playing that evening are asked to print and sign a roster prior to the start of their game and turn into the umpires.
 - Team rosters will serve as a team’s batting/kicking order for each game.
- No roster shall exceed twenty (20) players including a player/manager unless a special exception is made by the Athletic office.

PLACEMENT

- Teams will be placed into divisions based on their registration questions answered and previous season records if applicable.
