COLLEGE STATION CODE OF ORDINANCES:
CHAPTER 32 PARKS AND RECREATION

THE FOLLOWING ARE PROHIBITED IN ALL CITY PARKS:

- Glass bottles and containers
- Cutting, digging or destroying vegetation.
- Wading or swimming in park ponds.
- Littering
- Campfires
- Livestock
- Hot air balloons
- Dunking booths
- Confetti and glitter
- Golfing, including practice driving or hitting of golf balls

1. No tents or RV camping is allowed without approval from park staff.
2. All wildlife is protected.
3. All vehicles must park in designated areas on pavement only. Off-road vehicles are not allowed in city parks.
4. Non-city-related advertising is prohibited unless specified by a contract. Any person wishing to sell any items (food, drinks, shirts, caps, etc.) or solicit from park patrons must apply for a **Park Vendor's Permit** at the **Parks and Recreation Office** and possibly a **Health Permit** from the **Brazos County Health Department**.
5. All gyms, boot camps, and fitness groups must purchase a **Park Vendor Permit** through the **Parks and Recreation Office** to host workout sessions at city parks.
6. Alcohol may be consumed by adults 21 years of age or older. At functions where alcohol is served, alcohol or anything else cannot be sold without a TABC license.
7. Fishing in park ponds is free and open to the public. Texas Community Fishing Lake special regulations and state regulations apply to city ponds. Contact the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department for special and state regulations, fishing license information, and daily bag limits.
8. No pony rides, sidewalk chalk, crawfish boils, bounce houses without prior approval.
9. Obey all "FIELDS CLOSED" signs. Field status is updated daily at cstx.gov/fieldstatus.

PETS

1. Dogs must remain on a leash unless at a designated dog park. **Raccoon Run Trail at Lick Creek Park** is the only off-leash trail within College Station parks, and dogs on this trail must be under voice control.
2. While in heat, dogs are prohibited from using designated dog parks.
3. Dogs younger than four months are not allowed in off-leash parks.
4. Acts of aggression against other dogs are prohibited. Dogs must be removed if uncontrollable.
5. Handlers must stop dogs from digging holes and cover holes created by their dogs.
6. Any dog over four months of age must be vaccinated and registered with Brazos County. Registration tags can be purchased through your vet, or the Aggieland Humane Society.
7. Your dog must wear their current county and rabies vaccination tags. Registration shall cover one year from the date of issuance in conjunction with the rabies vaccination date.
8. It is unlawful to fail to clean up after your pet on public property.

RENTED SPACES



1. Pavilions may be used if not rented, but access to kitchen or restroom facilities is not allowed.
2. Athletic fields must be reserved separately from pavilion rentals.
3. Courts (tennis, pickleball, basketball, and sand volleyball) are open on a first-come, first-served basis and cannot be reserved.
4. Renters are required to follow all guidelines outlined in rental agreement.
